Approximately 11,000 people, of all ages, visit the Kingsburg Historical Park to attend events, memorial services, family gatherings, business conferences, and to participate in field trips from schools and senior assisted living facilities. As the last of the Baby Boomers enter the ranks of senior citizens, an ever-increasing number of visitors require assistance to move from the parking lot to the Meeting Hall or to move from one exhibit to another.

This grant proposal aims to acquire two six-passenger golf carts to transfer mobility-impaired visitors safely and efficiently.

The following documentation and price quote was obtained from Central Valley Carts (Visalia) and Golf Carts by Design (Fresno). In each case, a 48-volt 160 AH Lithium battery upgrade is included ensure sufficient power and longevity is available. The three models were selected based on the capacity to transport at least six passengers.

The preferred model is the Evolution D5 Ranger 6 because of the added safety factor provided by virtue of all three rows offering ease of access by older riders. The third row design of the E-Z-Go Valor 6 is higher and more difficult to access.

Over the past five years, the Kingsburg Historical Society has expended \$571,410 to upgrade and preserve the buildings and exhibits in the Kingsburg Historical Park, the Historic Kingsburg Jail and the Kingsburg Walking Tour exhibits. Funding for these projects has come from three primary sources: Historical Society revenue streams (26%), member and community-based donations (11%), and the generous support of the Larry L. Hillblom Foundation Neighborhood Grant Committee (63%).

5. **Community Need:** Describe the specific needs of the District that your project will meet.

The Kingsburg Tri-County Health District and the Kingsburg Historical Society share a common goal; to provide services to the community that contribute to our residents' and visitors' health and well-being. As the number of visitors has steadily increased, we have become aware of the corresponding increase in visitors with mobility impairments.

As documented by the U.S. Census Bureau and studies commissioned by the University of California Institute of Transportation Studies, the older adult (65 and over) population in the United States is quickly growing in proportion. It is expected to reach its highest point by 2030 when the baby boomers will have all passed age 65. In California, the elderly population is expected to grow more than twice as fast as the total population. Mobility is a critical element of one's quality of life regardless of one's age. Good mobility and decent transportation alternatives are important in enabling the older population to participate in daily activities and remain socially active.

Meeting the mobility needs of an aging population is one of the most substantial challenges facing California in the coming decades.

The Colorado State University Center for Healthy Aging has conducted numerous studies on the physiological and emotional impact of limitations imposed as a natural result of aging. Unfortunately, aging reduces mobility and mobility is key to a healthy quality of life. The transition from independent living to an “age in place” mentality abruptly and dramatically alters the quality of life and mental health. The Kingsburg Historical Society actively promotes field trips by senior living facilities as a way to encourage physical, emotional, and mental health.

Here are a few anecdotal examples. Last fall we hosted a group of 21 residents from senior citizens from the Quail Park Memory Care Residence in Visalia. Several of the visitors were not able to walk the short distances between the exhibits and museum structures. We used an older four-passenger golf cart to transport them to the Heritage Building on the North end of the park so a few could enjoy the old cars and buggies.

Recently, an elderly visitor fell while walking on flat surfaces simply because her ankle had rolled on her. She was embarrassed and commented so. At age 70, I find myself relying heavily on the existing golf cart to conduct tours and day-to-day activities at the Historical Park.

When we host large events, especially when a more senior group of attendees is expected, we use an existing four-passenger golf cart to move people and materials from the front parking lot to the Meeting Hall. However, one aging four-passenger golf cart is insufficient to meet the growing demand for assistance.

The acquisition of two six-passenger golf carts will allow us to facilitate the movement of more people with greater efficiency.

This letter is in response to your telephone request for a copy of your organization's determination letter. This letter will take the place of the copy you requested.

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in February 1972 granted your organization exemption from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in section 509(a)(2).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as stated in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each employee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Your organization is not required to file federal income tax returns unless it is subject to the tax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If your organization is subject to this tax, it must file an income tax return on the Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your organization's present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

The law requires you to make your organization's annual return available for public inspection without charge for three years after the due date of the return. If your organization had a copy of its application for recognition of exemption on July 15, 1987, it is also required to make available for public inspection a copy of the exemption application, any supporting documents and the exemption letter to any individual who requests such documents in person or in writing. You can charge only a reasonable fee for reproduction and actual postage costs for the copied materials. The law does not require you to provide copies of public inspection documents that are widely available, such as by posting them on the Internet (World Wide Web). You may be liable for a penalty of \$20 a day for each day you do not make these documents available for public inspection (up to a maximum of \$10,000 in the case of an annual return).

Every dollar invested in the Kingsburg Historical Park, the Historic Kingsburg Jail, and the Historic Walking Tour over the last 54 years has been done for a singular purpose; to preserve Kingsburg's unique history for future generations. At its core, the purpose and mission of the Kingsburg Historical Society is community service.

Components of that mission include the ongoing maintenance of 13 historic buildings, equipment, automobiles, and exhibits, the development of a first-class academic program based on California state standards, and thousands of volunteer hours donated by members, residents, and retired educators.

The list below is a portion of the myriad contributions of the Kingsburg Historical Society to the community.

- a. 2024: Established a \$5,000 multi-year scholarship fund to assist local elementary schools to afford K-6<sup>th</sup> grade field trips to the Historical Park. The fund helps to offset the admission cost when student body funds are used to pay for their visit. (e.g. Roosevelt 1<sup>st</sup> grade, Lincoln Elementary 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, and Clay School K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade.)
- b. 2022 Collaborate with the Chamber of Commerce to find funding to build a new stage for the Swedish Festival.
- c. 2020 – present: Established a discounted pricing structure to assist families, non-profit organizations, and local churches in utilizing the Historical Park facilities and grounds for events directly benefiting the community. (e.g. celebrations of life, outside church services during and after the Covid-19 pandemic, and non-profit fundraising events.)
- d. 2019 – Present: the Kingsburg Historical Society offers the 1921 Dodge and the 1927 LaFrance fire truck to the community for use in community parades. In addition, the Society President uses archives and historical resources of the Society to regularly develop Dala Monthly newspaper articles for the consumption of members of the community.
- e. 2019 – Present: Christmas at the Park Event: Each year the Historical Society decorates the Kingsburg Historical Park with a forest of Christmas trees, festive lights throughout, and all exhibits decorated for Christmas. The month-long

event is free to the public. On one night, children can meet with Santa for a family photo.

- f. 2019 – Present: Historic Kingsburg Walking Tour: The Kingsburg Historical Society developed, funded, and maintains a walking tour consisting of 13 kiosks throughout the Swedish Village. The purpose of the walking tour is to provide an opportunity for residents and visitors to gain an appreciation of the unique history of Kingsburg.
- g. The Historic Jail is open 24/7 and the Kingsburg Historical Park is open and staffed by volunteers for the benefit of the community at no cost.
- h. Maintain a comprehensive pictorial library available to residents, businesses, and the media at no cost.
- i. Maintain a pictorial history of every Kingsburg High School graduate and every Clay Elementary School class since 1889, and a collection of graduates from other schools. This collection continues to facilitate community historical research. As such it is one of the most popular exhibits serving multiple generations of Kingsburg and area residents.
- j. 2022-2024: \$26,200 was invested in The Hall of Fame exhibit to tell the diverse history of Native Americans and other ethnic groups that contributed to the development of Kingsburg. The Hall of Fame revitalization celebrates civic leaders, agricultural and business leaders, student leaders, and the athletic and academic accomplishments of Kingsburg residents. In addition, two computers have been installed in the Hall of Fame with plans to allow the public to conduct family tree research free of charge.
